Programs are conducted in locations central to disadvantaged neighborhoods, connecting young people with industry professionals and giving them inroads into community networks. They encourage artistic expression, technique, business best practices and practical application. Our events are tailored to unite the communities we serve through the universal languages of music, food and art.

HAPCO programs are free of charge and are designed to empower growth and development in creative fields. Through our Kenneth R. Tolbert Scholarship Fund, we award scholarships to disadvantaged students.

HAPCO emphasizes paying it forward – we give students real-world experience and mentoring from university-level educators and industry professionals who they can relate to and learn from. The majority of our instructors have overcome economic and social challenges to forge a path of personal success. They come from a full range of generations, including first generation Florida Highwaymen, and share their stories of how they creatively persevered through socially-turbulent times.

A bachelor's degree increases an individual's potential earnings by 59%. The disparity in income between just a high school diploma and a bachelor's degree can be the difference in living paycheck-to-paycheck versus having financial security.

ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained and Employed) individuals earn more than the Federal Poverty Level, but not enough for the cost of living where they live. They usually work two or three jobs to make ends meet. Their budgets are extremely tight, often not being able to afford basic necessities.

Children in these households cannot afford the tools needed to pursue creative arts passions. They do not have the disposable income for private lessons, a musical instrument or painting supplies. They often have limited access to transportation.

Master classes provide students with hands-on learning in technique, improvisation, live performance, entrepreneurship, home studio skills, college preparation, and music-related careers. Beyond the classroom, students have the opportunity to grow their network of peers and mentors while sharpening the skills that can open doors to music scholarships and future academic opportunities.

Music education offers young people far more than technical ability on an instrument. It cultivates discipline, creativity, confidence, and collaboration – skills that benefit them both in and out of the classroom.

HAPCO Health provides education and services for residents of underserved neighborhoods. Our programs combine evidence-based traditional, lifestyle and functional medicine approaches to help people take control of their health.

We focus on long-term preventive strategies that improve how people feel and function every day, reducing chronic disease, improving nutrition and increasing overall resilience for families, especially those living in poverty.

Our programs serve all ages, supporting parents, caregivers and children. By removing health-related barriers, we help individuals improve their healthspans.

- Health education including nutrition, physical activity, stress management, sleep, risky substance avoidance and social connection
- · Nutrition and cooking classes
- · Creative "prescriptions" of nature, music, art and self-expression

Our goal is simple: build healthier communities by helping people prevent illness, make informed choices and thrive — for life.

The Power of Music

Music has a powerful effect on the brain, activating areas involved in thinking, movement, sensation and emotion. Whether listening or performing, music can support both physical and mental health. Research shows music can improve mood, reduce stress and depression, boost cognitive performance and even enhance movement, mobility and balance.

The Power of Nature

Spending time in nature can lower stress, improve mood, and reduce the risk of depression and anxiety. It also supports physical health by lowering blood pressure, heart rate and cortisol levels. Regular exposure to natural outdoor environments has been shown to improve overall health by up to 92% — and mental health by as much as 98%.

Life Expectancy

US adults in the top 1% of income live significantly longer than those in the bottom 1% — by 14.6 years for men and 10.1 years for women.

Chronic Disease

Many chronic conditions are influenced by modifiable lifestyle factors including alcohol/tobacco use, physical inactivity and poor nutrition. Common chronic diseases include cardiovascular diseases, cancer, diabetes, high blood pressure, obesity, sleep apnea, arthritis and nonalcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD).

Food Insecurity

In 2023, 13.5% of US households faced food insecurity. Limited access to nutritious, affordable food increases the risk of chronic disease.


